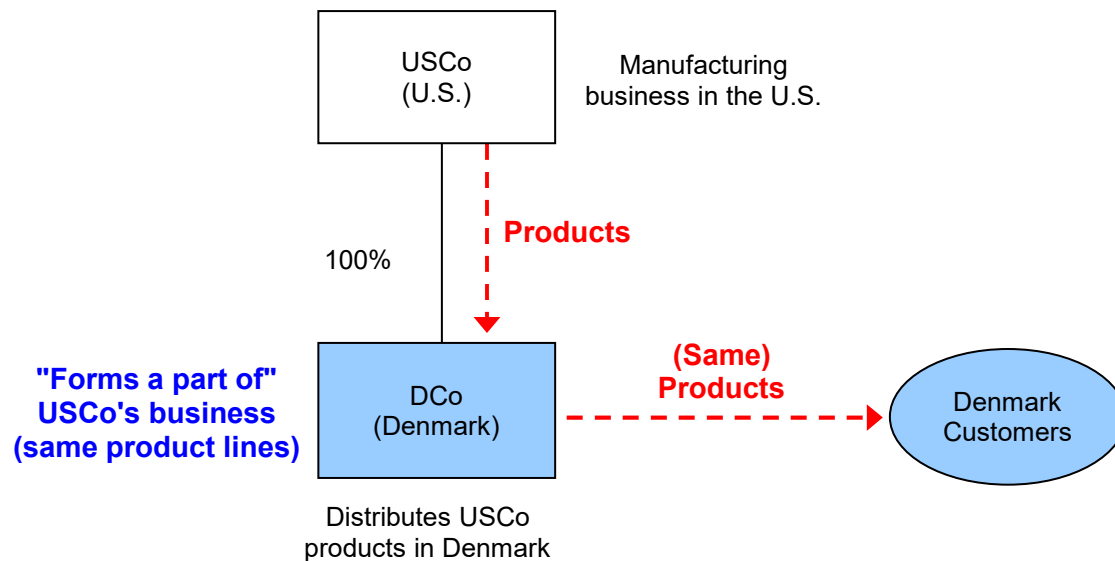

**Active trade or
business test

connection with")**

USCo is a corporation resident in the United States. USCo is engaged in an active manufacturing business in the United States. USCo owns 100 percent of the shares of DCo, a company resident in Denmark. DCo distributes USCo products in Denmark. Because the business activities conducted by the two corporations involve the same products, DCo's distribution business is considered to form a part of USCo's manufacturing business.
