

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## Limitation on benefits:

Active trade or business test ("derived in connection with")

USCo is a corporation resident in the United States. USCo owns 100 percent of the shares of ICo, a corporation resident in Iceland. USCo operates a large research and development facility in the United States that licenses intellectual property to affiliates worldwide, including ICo. ICo and other USCo affiliates then manufacture and market the USCo-designed products in their respective markets. Since the activities conducted by ICo and USCo involve the same product lines, these activities are considered to form a part of the same trade or business.
